**Entry Fee: Adult: \$1.00 per entry Child: \$0.50 per entry**

### General Rules

- All entries to be on an official entry form (see back of schedule)
- All entries to be grown, made or created by the named exhibitor
- Presentation of awards will be at 12 noon on Show Day.
- Entries, Cups, Trophies and Awards must not be removed from the hall before 2.30pm on show day.
- Judging to take place prior to show day.
- Judges decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into
- A maximum of **1 ENTRY** by one individual exhibitor **PER CATEGORY**

### CHILDRENS and TEENAGE SECTION – CATEGORIES 1 – 18

- Ages as at 31 December 2017
- Presentation is important and must be the work of the exhibitor
- Food items to be presented on white disposable or china plate and covered in clear plastic
- Exhibitors name, age and phone number must be on base of entry

### Pre School – under 5 years – most points = Katikati Eves Challenge Cup

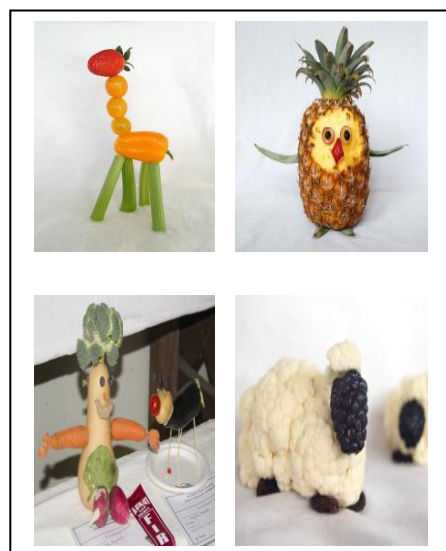

**ADULT SECTION – CATEGORIES 19 – 77 (from 17 years upwards)**

- Any sized jar with removable lid – no wax seals. **Make sure the lid is easily removable for judging.**
- All jars must be clean and labeled
- All entries must be homemade
- Presentation is important
- Exhibitors name and phone number must be on base of entry

The first A&P show in New Zealand was held in 1842 in the Bay of Islands, the idea having originated in the UK to promote agriculture

**Jams, Pickles and Preserves Section – most points = Katikati WDFE Tray**

<b>Category</b>	19	Jelly - any fruit
	20	Jam - Berry
	21	Jam – Stone fruit
	22	Marmalade – any fruit
	23	Lemon Honey/ Curd
	24	Relish or Chutney/Pickle
	25	Preserves -best presented preserved veges or fruit - appearance only - do not decorate jar
	26	Sauce - (savoury)
	27	Gift basket - (size 30cm max) your choice of jams, preserves, sauces - Jars to be labeled - judged on presentation only

**Produce Section – most points = Cole Trophy**

- Judge, Bill Ward's helpful hints ...
  - **Vegetables and fruit must be washed and outer leaves trimmed**
  - **Onions - leave skin and roots on**
  - **Rhubarb -even size and colour with pulled base(not cut)**
  - **Courgettes and Cucumbers -keep stem attached**
  - **Fruit - to be matching size and colour**
  - **Tomatoes - beware of cracking and splitting**
  - **NB: Tomatoes and Avocados are both fruit**
  - **Eggs - same size and colour**
- Presentation is important
- To be judged on quality unless otherwise stated
- Entries to be presented on white disposable or china plate, except for collection of 5 vegetables/fruits (basket or plate) and eggs (carton)
- Exhibitors name and phone number must be on base of entry

- Presentation is important
- Exhibitors name and phone number must be on base of entry

- Present in own container
- Presentation is important
- Exhibitors name and phone number must be on base of entry

- Presentation is important
- Entries must be unused and created or made within the past year
- Exhibitors name and phone number must be on base of entry
